1. Introduction

The Jean Monnet Centre of Excellence was created in 2003 with the financial support of the European Commission under its <u>Jean Monnet Action</u> and co-funded by the University of Manchester.

At the end of a three-year funding period its focus was broadened away from its initial concern with the European Union to European Studies more generally. At the same time the JMCE became more broadly based with partners from the University of Manchester, Manchester Metropolitan University, the University of Chester and other local organisations.

The JMCE aims to provide a platform for European Studies-related activities and research in Greater Manchester and the North West of England. The Centre aims to strengthen the intellectual community in European Studies, while also facilitating local, regional and international links with practitioners, researchers, students and others interested in European affairs.

JMCE Centre relies on subscriptions from its principal stakeholders for its operation and is grateful for their continuing support.

The following pages report specifically on the structure and achievements of the Centre during the academic year 2019-20. The outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic and the subsequent closure of campuses has had a very disruptive impact on our scheduled events. 

4.6. Alliance Manchester Business School

Researching employment (in)equalities in an uncertain Europe: Postgraduate Research Methods Series*

In the contexts of Brexit and migration/freedom of movement debate coupled with the damaging side of technological advances affecting working conditions, growing work intensification and shrinking workers' rights, there has been widening disparities between EU nation states' rising trends of precarity. In addition to this, austerity cuts have left a funding crisis in public services such as health and social care in the UK.

Such crises and disparities have become central concerns in the academic and

policy discourse across Europe, particularly in the area of research focusing on the world of work, which have found a more complex pattern of intersecting inequalities appearing as well as increasing gaps/hierarchies in pay, power and gender in different forms o f employment. Adding an increasingly diverse workforce to the scene introduces more complexities and creates new challenges for businesses, employers, and workers.

The seminar series aims to help develop a methodological foundation to equip doctoral students to tackle these complex, and often sensitive, issues that arise during their research.


